4. Reports: Departments and Committees

a. Sewer Report: Written report was received.

Mayor Michael Hammond read the Sewer report aloud. Discussion was held on Outside users and the Corning Plant. Attorney Henry Leader will be asked to check

into these two matters and possibly have discussion on revamping these current contracts as they are from 1999. Concern was expressed that Corning is constantly expanding with employees but the quarterly billing has not increased. Discussion was held on the tractor at the Sewer Plant and the possibility of putting it up for sale/bid. Discussed later in the agenda. Mayor Hammond noted that Deputy Mayor Charles Fififled is not present so therefore no decisions will be made.

b. Code Enforcement Report: Written receipt was received.

Tuttle went over his report. Tuttle noted that two items were off the list and taken care of. Tuttle has been incontact with the Attorney for the Village on a particular matter. The Village Board members gave Code Enforcement Officer Tim Tuttle approval to have a contractor Middlemiss Trucking clean up the property at whatever cost with a \$100.00 deposit, plus tipping fees and this will be reimbursed by the resident. Tuttle to communicate with the Contractor and the homeowner with the guidance of the Village Attorney. Board members also gave approval for Attorney Henry Leader to send letters to three home owners in the Village about violations at their properties by Certified mail.

Mayor Michael Hammond stated that he was contacted by a resident about the recently burnt house of Robert Eatons on Front Street and a garbage issue at Kevin Reynolds rentals. Hammond noted that he has been in contact with Reynolds and in good faith is trying to get matters fixed. Tim Tuttle noted a pool issue was rectified and clean up has happened at Bennetts rental.

Mayor Hammond noted he has been doing alot of homework on Street projects and will be covering his monthly matters throughout the rest of the agenda.

Falls Festival Committee: Meeting was held prior to the Village monthly regular board meeting. Discussion was held on sponsors and raising money for the Festival

5. New Business:

a. Local ARPA Complete Submission Confirmation:

Mayor Michael Hammond noted that he completed the submission before the July 9th deadline of the 1.2 million Canton Town is getting; the

Village of Rensselaer Falls is supposed to receive \$31,359.00 of that. This is Stimulus money. This is based on about \$108.00 a head (Village residents) Mayor Hammond noted that he worked with Karen Clary to complete this task. A brief discussion was held on what the money can be used for.

b. Village Tractor BIDS:

Discussion was held on placing the Village Tractor out to bid. Mayor Hammond noted that this is just for bids. Mark Basford to write up specs on the matter and Clerk Hammond will get it to the newspaper.

c. Part Time Maintenance Posting:

Mayor Michael Hammond noted that he and a volunteer have been mowing and weed eating in the Village. Hammond stated that more than just mowing needs to be done around the Village and would like to put out a posting to hire someone with skills to tackle cleanup, mowing and recreational matters in the Village. Motion was made by Trustee Jolene LaSiege to post the job and ask for help with the festival and any other activity that might take place, seconded by Stacy Gushea. All voted in favor.

6. Updates.

a. Heuvelton Street Project - Discussion & Possible Approval:

Mayor Hammond stated that he received estimates on both the Heuvelton and W. Front Street projects outside the Town of Canton's quote. One from Matt Murdock and one from Jeff Crowbar. Both were on par to do the middle work, milling, etc. Hammond noted that the Town of Canton now is on page with doing the work and came in under what the private contractors quoted. Hammond wants to send letters out to the Contractors thanking them for their interest, but thinks the Town of Canton is the way to go due to the cost savings. Sheenans will do the milling, Town of Canton grading and excavation work, leveling and

building road up and paving with Sheenans materials.

7. Any other business that may come before the Board:

Mayor Michael Hammond introduced Jody Wenzel from the St. Lawrence County Self Insurance Plan. Wenzel stated he covers workmen's compensation plans. and is here to help. Wenzel handles safety and compliance issues with the surrounding municipalities. Wenzel will be coming out to the Village of Rensselaer Falls to check on safety issues and compliance issues handed down from OSHA. After Wenzel completes his audit he will send a written report with issues found and recommendations for compliance. Fire Department member Mark Bomyea asked about changes to the forms for workmans comp and a brief discussion was held with Wenzel. Bomyea will meet with Wenzel to go over the Fire Department Audit. The Fire Department will be holding a chicken bbq on fathers day June 20. Ron Stiles expressed his concerns over the new sidewalk on Canton Street being hit by the snow plow. A brief discussion was held with Steven Smith on marking it before winter. Mayor Hammond noted this is one of the problems with being disconnected from the Town of Canton adding that he hopes that this changes in the near future.
